ORGANISER AND LOCATION

The DroneCon 2026 MultiGP Eastern Asia Regional Qualification will take place in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia.



Ulaanbaatar is the capital and largest city of Mongolia, serving as the country's political, economic, and technological center. The city is rapidly developing in the fields of innovation, digital transformation, and advanced technologies, making it an emerging destination for international technology-based events.

The area surrounding Buyant-Ukhaa International Airport offers open space and suitable infrastructure for drone racing, technical operations, and large-scale outdoor events. The location provides convenient access for both domestic and international participants.



Ulaanbaatar is the capital and most populous city of Mongolia. It serves as the country's political, economic, and technological center, and is increasingly developing in the fields of innovation, digital transformation, and advanced aviation-related technologies.

The competition venue will be located in the vicinity of Buyant-Ukhaa International Airport, in Khan-Uul District, Ulaanbaatar. This area provides suitable open space and operational conditions for drone racing, technical inspection, demonstration flights, and large-scale outdoor event activities.

The location also offers convenient accessibility for both domestic and international participants, as well as efficient logistics for equipment transportation and event organization.

Average Weather Conditions in Ulaanbaatar

According to historical climate data, the average temperature in Ulaanbaatar during late May ranges between 10°C and 20°C (50°F – 68°F).

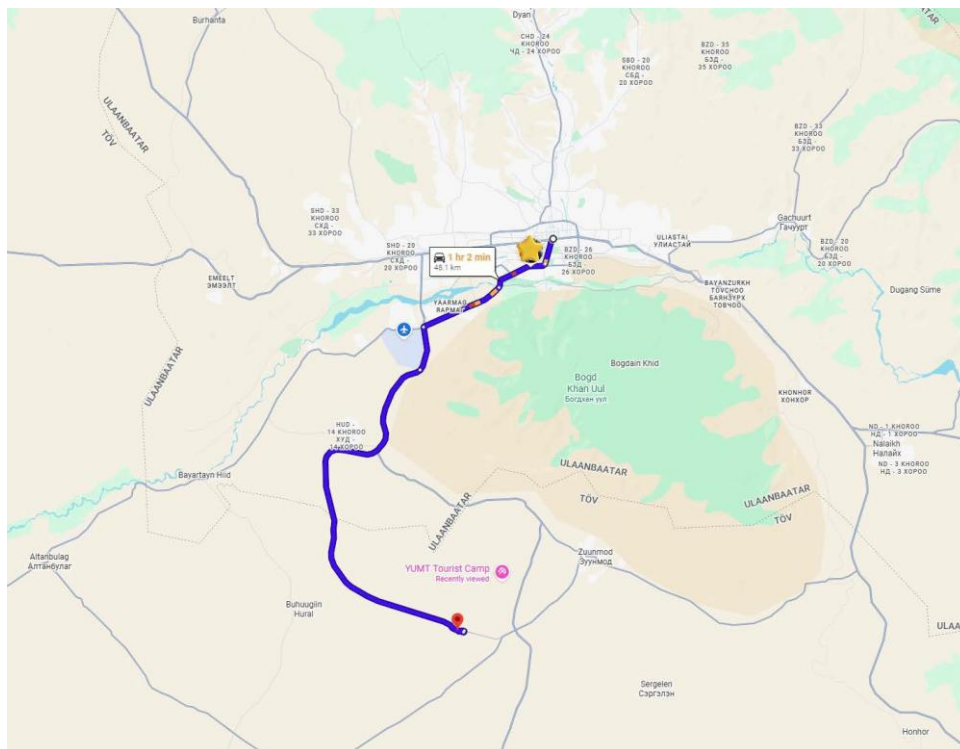
Weather conditions are generally dry, with moderate wind and clear skies, making it suitable for outdoor drone operations and competition activities.

Wind conditions are typically stable; however, participants are advised to prepare for possible variations in wind speed during flight sessions.

Chinggis Khaan International Airport

The nearest international airport is Chinggis Khaan International Airport (UBN), located approximately 50 kilometers from Ulaanbaatar city center.

All international participants are expected to arrive at this airport.

Organized Transport

The organizing committee will provide airport pickup services for all participants.

Participants will be transported from Chinggis Khaan International Airport to their designated hotels.

On competition days, shuttle buses will also be provided to transport participants from their hotels to the competition venue and return.

Detailed schedules and transportation arrangements will be provided in the next bulletin.

PARTICIPANTS

Team Composition

Each participating team may consist of the following members:

Team Manager

Each team must appoint a team manager. The manager may be a dedicated person or one of the competing pilots.

Pilots (Competitors)

Each team may register up to three (3) main pilots without age or gender restrictions.

Additionally, teams may include:

one (1) junior pilot, and/or

one (1) female pilot

A team must include at least one pilot and may consist of a maximum of five (5) pilots in total, including additional categories.

Helpers / Technical Assistants

Each pilot may be accompanied by one (1) helper responsible for technical support, preparation, and equipment handling.

Supporters

Teams may include supporters; however, their access to restricted operational areas may be limited.

Individual Participants

The championship also allows individual participation for pilots who are not part of a registered team, subject to approval by the organizing committee.

Individual participants must:

- complete registration within the official deadline,
- comply with all technical and safety requirements,
- and follow the official competition rules and procedures.

The organizing committee reserves the right to approve or limit individual entries based on capacity and competition structure.

Eligibility

- The competition is open to both national and international participants.
- There are no strict age or gender restrictions unless specified in certain categories.
- Participants must have sufficient piloting skills and technical understanding to safely operate UAV systems.

Responsibility

All participants are fully responsible for:

- the safety and airworthiness of their equipment,
- compliance with competition rules and regulations,
- and any damage caused to people, property, or infrastructure during the event.

Organizing Committee Rights

The organizing committee reserves the right to:

- verify and approve all participant registrations,
- limit the numbers of participant, if necessary,
- modify participation conditions in case of safety, technical, or organizational requirements.

CLASSIFICATIONS AND AWARDS

Important note - All competitors will compete for the overall individual classification. Depending on the category, additional classifications such as Junior and Women categories may be applied.

Participants competing as part of a registered team will also contribute to the team classification results.

Individual overall classification

Awards will be presented to the top three (3) competitors in each category:

- 1st Place – Gold Medal + Prize
- 2nd Place – Silver Medal + Prize
- 3rd Place – Bronze Medal + Prize

The winner will be recognized as the DRONECON Champion of the respective category.

Prize Fund (International Category)

5-inch Drone Racing

- 1st Place: \$5,000
- 2nd Place: \$3,000
- 3rd Place: \$2,000

Tiny Whoop Category

- 1st Place: \$1,400
- 2nd Place: \$800
- 3rd Place: \$500

Drone Soccer Competition

- 1st Place: \$1,400
- 2nd Place: \$800
- 3rd Place: \$500

DEADLINES

Preliminary Registration Form (intent to participate with estimated number of team members): 1 April 2026

Final Online Registration Deadline: 25 May 2026

Registration must be completed through the official online registration system designated by the organizing committee. Detailed instructions regarding the registration process and required documents will be provided in the next bulletin and official event communication.

There is no entry fee for participation in DRONECON 2026.

Note: Participants may be required to submit additional supporting documents during the registration process, including identification details, team information, and other materials requested by the organizers.

Late registrations may not be accepted except in exceptional circumstances and with prior approval from the organizing committee.

In the event that a participant or team withdraws after registration, the organizing committee should be informed in advance.

LODGING AND FOOD

Lodging

Accommodation

All official participants will be accommodated by the organizers.

Participants will stay at:

Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia

Accommodation is provided under the coordination of the Mongolian Civil Aviation Authority (MCAA).

The hotel offers suitable conditions for international participants, including comfortable rooms, dining facilities, and convenient access to transportation and the competition venue.

FOOD

Meals will be provided for all registered participants throughout the event.

- Breakfast, lunch, and dinner will be arranged by the organizers
- Special dietary requirements (including vegetarian meals) can be accommodated upon request

Official Banquet

An official banquet will be organized after the Award Ceremony and Closing Ceremony.

All registered participants will be invited to attend.

LOCAL TRANSPORTATION

The organizing committee will provide transportation services for participants:

- Airport pickup and transfer to the hotel upon arrival
- Daily shuttle service between the hotel and the competition venue
- Transportation for official event activities

Detailed transportation schedules will be provided upon arrival and in the next bulletin.

INSURANCE

The organizer will provide basic third-party liability coverage during the competition period.

Participants are strongly recommended to arrange their own health and travel insurance prior to arrival.

VISA

Participants are responsible for obtaining the appropriate visa to enter Mongolia.

The organizing committee will provide official invitation letters upon request to support visa applications.

General requirements may include:

- A valid passport (minimum 6 months validity)
- Completed visa application form
- Recent passport-size photograph

Participants are advised to contact their nearest Mongolian Embassy or Consulate for detailed visa requirements.

Bulletin 2 will be published after the deadline fixed to send the Preliminary Entry Form.

Registration on the venue

Final registration and accreditation will be completed upon arrival.

Team managers may be required to confirm participant details and receive official materials such as accreditation badges and event information packages.

Medical service

Medical support will be available throughout the event.

An ambulance, medical staff, and first aid services will be on standby during the competition to ensure participant safety.

Electricity

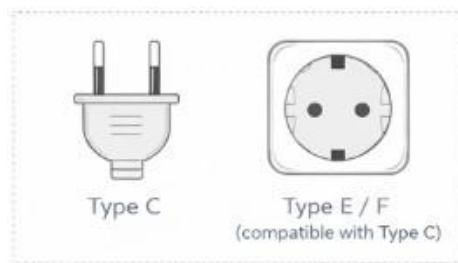
Mongolia operates on a 220V supply voltage and 50Hz frequency.

The commonly used plug types are:

Type C (two round pins)

Type E/F (compatible with Type C)

Participants are advised to bring appropriate power adapters if required for their equipment.



Local currency

The official currency of Mongolia is the Mongolian Tögrög (MNT).

Currency exchange is available at:

- Chinggis Khaan International Airport
- Commercial banks
- Authorized exchange offices
- International bank cards (Visa, MasterCard) are widely accepted in hotels and major establishments.
- ATMs are available throughout Ulaanbaatar.

Communication

- Free Wi-Fi will be available at the hotel and main event areas
- Mobile networks in Mongolia are stable and widely accessible
- Popular international applications such as Google services, Facebook, Instagram, WhatsApp, and YouTube are fully accessible in Mongolia.

Spectators and media

The event venue will be open to the public.

Live drone competition footage will be displayed on screens for spectators

Real-time scoring and rankings will be available during the competition

Media coverage, photography, and broadcasting will be organized by the event team

The organizing committee will ensure broad media exposure for the event.
